Task: Rock Music Composition

Weighting: 15%
Due Date: Week 9/10

Criteria:

Students are to complete a short chord progression/rock piece which represents a style of Rock music studied using Sibelius or MuseScore
Your composition should include:

- Title of your music – Identify the style of Rock (Heavy, Soft, Reggae, Disco).
- Minimum of three layers –

Electric Guitar/Keys – Chords I IV V vi

Bass Guitar – Riff pattern based on root note of chord

Drumkit – Backbeat pertaining to the style – see worksheet.

Melody (4 bar solo) using G Pentatonic/E Minor Pentatonic – optional

- G Major or E Minor Key Signature
- Minimum 16 bars- *no longer than 22 bars*
- Explore the rhythmic patterns of the Rock styles – Heavy, Soft, Reggae, Disco).
- Consider a set chord progression (*12BB or ice cream chord changes*)
- Appropriate time signature and tempo pertaining to the style
- Appropriate Dynamic and expressive technique markings.
- Submit a hard copy of your composition to your classroom teacher

<p>Thorough(13-16) B</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Thorough understanding and demonstration of melodic/chord/bassline material for a Rock music score with much thought to the overall sound/success reflective of the style chosen * Three instruments chosen and written with a successful format * Detailed use of rhythm and pitches for each instrument for 16 bars * Chosen Time signature and tempo with thorough understanding of meaning and use throughout piece * Detailed navigation of the music software to produce a comprehensive composition with appropriate Dynamics and Expressive Techniques 	
<p>Sound(8-12) C</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Basic understanding and demonstration of melodic/chord/bassline material for Rock music with little inaccuracies * Two instruments chosen and written with a sound format * Sound use of rhythm and pitches for each instrument for 16 bars * Chosen Time signature and tempo with sound understanding of meaning and use throughout piece * Sound navigation of the music software to produce a competent composition with some Dynamics and Expressive Techniques 	
<p>Basic (4-7) D</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Basic understanding and demonstration of melodic/chord/bassline material for Rock music with inaccuracies * Two instruments chosen and written with a basic format * Basic use of rhythm and pitches for each instrument for 16 bars or less * Chosen Time signature and tempo with basic understanding of meaning and use throughout piece * Basic navigation of the music software to produce a simple composition with few Dynamics and Expressive Techniques 	
<p>Limited (1-4) E</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Limited understanding and demonstration of melodic/chord material for Rock music with many inaccuracies * Two or less instruments written with many inaccuracies * Limited use of rhythm and pitches for each instrument for 16 bars or less * Chosen Time signature and tempo with limited understanding of meaning and use throughout piece * Inadequate navigation of the music software to produce an unsuccessful composition with little or no Dynamics and Expressive Techniques
