Task:

Introduction: The aim of this Research Project is for you to find out relevant information about a German speaking country that interests you. You have a wide choice of topics and can follow your interests.

HOW TO START:

Using the Internet and other reference material, research 4 of the following topics. Present your findings report (the report is to be submitted in a clear plastic folder). Use pictures, images and detailed, relevant information on each of your 4 topics.

Projekt 1 – Geographie

Compare your home country with a German-speaking country.

Projekt 2 – Eine deutsche Stadt

Research a German speaking town/city of your choice.

Projekt 3 – Deutsche in Australien

Interview someone who has emigrated to Australia from a German-speaking country

Projekt 4 – Biographie

Research the life of a famous German speaking person or a famous German product.

Projekt 5 – Ein deutsches Produkt

Research a famous German product sold in Australia.

Projekt 6 – Ein deutsches Fest

Research a German festival or public holiday.

Projekt 7 – Eine deutsche tradition

Research a German tradition.

Projekt 8 – Deutsche Geschichte.

Research an event in German history.

Word count - 1200 words. You must write in your own words and clearly identify when quotes are used. Word count is only a base indicator. Quality of research, relevance and presentation will all be taken into consideration in the marking criteria of this project. However, it is advised that you use similar word counts for each project to ensure depth of research for each topic.
