Task Number: 2B Oral Presentation

Date of Task: Thursday 15 June 2017. Week 8, Term 1

Task Value: 20% (Speaking 15%/Representing 5%)

Nature of Task: Students will present an informative, formal lecture to their teachers and an audience of their peers. This lecture **MUST** focus on the play studied this term, (Cosi by Louis Nowra) and a VISUAL related text. **In this lecture, students must teach the group about how the concept of Conflict has been explored and represented in each of the texts they have chosen, comparing the approach each composer has adopted in presenting the concept of Conflict.**

To enhance your lecture, it should be accompanied by a visual presentation created on Microsoft PowerPoint, Microsoft MovieMaker, Prezi or the like. For example, you can include sections of poetry, carefully selected images or symbols, or excerpts from your related text. You should take advantage of your ICT skills to create a presentation which is engaging and supportive of the ideas you are exploring in your presentation. You may include 30 second video clips, but should not simply show five minute blocks of film.

Word/Page Limit: This lecture **MUST** run between four and five minutes, which includes time (plus any penalties applicable) used to show any video. At five minutes, you will be asked to sit down.

Other Information: Students will be asked to sign up for a specific time in which to give their presentation. Ideally the presentation will be either during the student's free period. Presentations will be given to two teachers, and a small group of students. Presentations will take place on the BSC in Rooms TBA.

Outcomes Assessed:
